Winners and school principals will be notified by April. The presentation of the award will be made at a reception.

WINNERS MUST ATTEND THE RECEPTION ON THURSDAY, APRIL 19, 2012 from 5:30 P.M. until 8:00 P.M. TO RECEIVE THE SCHOLARSHIP. If a winner is not present, the scholarship will be awarded to another candidate. The scholarship is unrestricted and may be used for tuition, room and board, books, travel expenses, etc.
